



# Feast Foundations

Leviticus23 (1) And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying, (2) Speak unto the children of Israel, and say unto them, Concerning the feasts of the LORD, which ye shall proclaim to be holy convocations, even these are my feasts. (3) Six days shall work be done: but the seventh day is the sabbath of rest, an holy convocation; ye shall do no work therein: it is the sabbath of the LORD in all your dwellings. (4) These are the feasts of the LORD, even holy convocations, which ye shall proclaim in their seasons. (37) These are the feasts of the LORD, which ye shall proclaim to be holy convocations, to offer an offering made by fire unto the LORD, a burnt offering, and a meat offering, a sacrifice, and drink offerings, every thing upon his day. (see Levit 25:1-12 & Deut 16:1-17)

DOUBLED Deliverance Destruction SPRING	Exodus12 (1) And the LORD spake unto Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, saying, (2) <u>This month shall be unto you the beginning of months: it shall be your first month of the year to you.</u> (3) Speak ye unto all the congregation of Israel, saying, <u>In the tenth day of this month they shall take to them every man a lamb,</u> according to the house of their fathers, <u>a lamb for an house:</u> (4) And if the household be too little for the lamb, let him and his neighbour next unto his house take it according to the number of the souls; every man according to his eating shall make your count for the lamb. (5) <u>Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male of the first year:</u> ye shall take it out from the sheep, or from the goats: (6) <u>And ye shall keep it up until the fourteenth day of the same month; and the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill it in the evening.</u> (7) <u>And they shall take of the blood, and strike it on the two side posts and on the upper door post of the houses, wherein they shall eat it.</u> (8) And they shall eat the flesh in that night, roast with fire, and unleavened bread; and with bitter herbs they shall eat it. (10) And ye shall let nothing of it remain until the morning; and that which remaineth of it until the morning ye shall burn with fire. (11) And thus shall ye eat it; with your loins girded, your shoes on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and ye shall eat it in haste: it is the LORD's passover. (12) For I will pass through the land of Egypt this night, and will smite all the first-born in the land of Egypt, both man and beast; and against all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgment: <u>I am the LORD.</u> (13) <u>And the blood shall be to you for a token upon the houses where ye are: and when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and the plague shall not be upon you to destroy you, when I smite the land of Egypt.</u> (14) <u>And this day shall be unto you for a memorial; and ye shall keep it a feast to the LORD throughout your generations; ye shall keep it a feast by an ordinance for ever.</u> (22) ... none of you shall go out ... until the morning. (1)Passover		Exodus12 (15) <u>Seven days shall ye eat unleavened bread; even the first day ye shall put away leaven out of your houses:</u> for whosoever eateth unleavened bread from the first day until the seventh day, that soul shall be cut off from Israel. (16) And in the first day there shall be an holy convocation, and in the seventh day there shall be an holy convocation to you; no manner of work shall be done in them, save that which every man must eat, that only may be done of you. (17) And ye shall observe the feast of unleavened bread: for in this selfsame day have I brought your armies out of the land of Egypt: therefore shall ye observe this day in your generations by an ordinance for ever. (18) In the first month, on the fourteenth day of the month, at even, ye shall eat unleavened bread, until the one and twentieth day of the month at even. (19) Seven days shall there be no leaven found in your houses: for whosoever eateth that which is leavened, even that soul shall be cut off from the congregation of Israel, whether he be a stranger, or born in the land. (20) Ye shall eat nothing leavened; in all your habitations shall ye eat unleavened bread. (21) <u>And it came to pass, that at midnight the LORD smote all the firstborn in the land of Egypt,</u> from the firstborn of Pharaoh that sat on his throne unto the firstborn of the captive that was in the dungeon; and all the firstborn of cattle. (31) <u>And he called for Moses and Aaron by night, and said, Rise up, and get you forth from among my people, both ye and the children of Israel; and go, serve the LORD, as ye have said.</u> (32) Also take your flocks and your herds, as ye have said, and be gone; and bless me also. (33) And the Egyptians were urgent upon the people, that they might send them out of the land in haste; ... (34) And the people took their dough before it was leavened, their kneading-troughs being bound up in their clothes upon their shoulders. (39) <u>And they baked unleavened cakes of the dough which they brought ... because they were thrust out of Egypt, and could not tarry ...</u> (2)Unleavened		Exodus12 (37) And the children of Israel journeyed from Rameses to Succoth, about six hundred thousand on foot that were men, beside children. (38) And a mixed multitude went up also with them; and flocks, and herds, even very much cattle. Exodus13 (21) <u>And the LORD went before them by day in a pillar of a cloud, to lead them the way, and by night in a pillar of fire, to give them light: to go by day and night:</u> Ex14 (8) And the LORD hardened the heart of Pharaoh king of Egypt, and he pursued after the children of Israel: ... (10) And when Pharaoh drew nigh, ... the children of Israel cried out unto the LORD. (19) And the angel of God ... removed and went behind them: and the pillar of the cloud went from before their face (20) <u>And it came between the camp of the Egyptians and the camp of Israel: ... so that the one came not near the other all the night.</u> (21) <u>And Moses stretched out his hand over the sea; and the LORD caused the sea to go back by a strong east wind all that night, and made the sea dry land, and the waters were divided.</u> (22) <u>And the children of Israel went into the midst of the sea upon the dry ground; and the waters were a wall unto them on their right hand, and on their left.</u> (24) And it came to pass, that in the morning watch the LORD looked unto the host of the Egyptians through the pillar of fire and of the pillar of the cloud, and troubled the host of the Egyptians, (27) <u>And Moses stretched forth his hand over the sea, and the sea returned to his strength when the morning appeared; and the Egyptians fled against it; and the LORD overthrew the Egyptians in the midst of the sea.</u> (28) And the waters returned, and covered ... all the host of Pharaoh ... (29) <u>But the children of Israel walked upon dry land ...</u> (30) <u>Thus the LORD saved Israel that day out of the hand of the Egyptians: ...</u> (31) <u>And Israel saw that great work which the LORD did upon the Egyptians: and the people feared the LORD, and believed the LORD, and his servant Moses.</u> Exodus15 (1) Then sang Moses and the children of Israel this song		Exodus19 (1) <u>In the third month,</u> when the children of Israel were gone forth out of the land of Egypt, the same day came they into the wilderness of Sinai. (2) ... and there Israel camped before the mount. (3) <u>And Moses went up unto God, and the LORD called unto him out of the mountain, saying, Thus shall thou say to the house of Jacob, and tell the children of Israel: (4) Ye have seen what I did unto the Egyptians, and how I bare you on eagles' wings, and brought you unto myself.</u> (5) ... if ye will obey my voice indeed, and keep my covenant, then ye shall be a peculiar treasure unto me above all people: for all the earth is mine: (6) <u>And ye shall be unto me a kingdom of priests, and an holy nation.</u> ... (8) And all the people answered together, and said, All that the LORD hath spoken we will do. ... (9) And the LORD said unto Moses, Lo, I come unto thee in a thick cloud, that the people may hear when I speak with thee, and believe thee for ever. ... (10) And the LORD said unto Moses, Go unto the people, and sanctify them to day and to morrow, and let them wash their clothes, (11) And be ready against the third day: for the third day the LORD will come down in the sight of all the people upon mount Sinai. (16) <u>And it came to pass on the third day in the morning that there were thunders and lightnings, and a thick cloud upon the mount, and the voice of the trumpet exceeding loud:</u> (18) <u>And mount Sinai was altogether on a smoke, because the LORD descended upon it in fire: ... and the whole mount quaked greatly.</u> (19) <u>And when the voice of the trumpet sounded long, and waxed louder and louder, Moses spake, and God answered him by a voice.</u> (20) <u>And the LORD came down upon mount Sinai, on top of the mount: and the LORD called Moses up to the top of the mount: and Moses went up.</u> (21) And the LORD said unto Moses, Go down, charge the people, ... (22) And the priests also, which come near the LORD, sanctify themselves ... (24) ... Away, get thee down, and thou shalt come up, thou, and Aaron with thee:		Exodus24 (1) And he said unto Moses, Come up unto the LORD, thou, and Aaron, Nadab, and Abihu, and seventy of the elders of Israel; and worship ye afar off. (2) And Moses alone shall come near the LORD: but they shall not come nigh: neither shall the people go up with him. (3) And Moses came and told the people all the words of the LORD, and all the judgments: and all the people answered with one voice, and said, All the words which the LORD hath said we will do. (4) <u>And Moses wrote all the words of the LORD, and rose up early in the morning, and builded an altar under the hill, and twelve pillars, according to the twelve tribes of Israel.</u> (5) <u>And he sent young men of the children of Israel, which offered burnt offerings, and sacrificed peace offerings of oxen unto the LORD.</u> (6) <u>And Moses took half of the blood, and put it in basons: and half of the blood he sprinkled on the altar.</u> (7) <u>And he took the book of the covenant, and read in the audience of the people: and they said, All that the LORD hath said will we do, and be obedient.</u> (8) <u>And Moses took the blood, and sprinkled it on the people, and said, Behold the blood of the covenant, which the LORD hath made with you concerning all these words.</u> (9) Then went up Moses, and Aaron, Nadab, and Abihu, and seventy of the elders of Israel: (10) <u>And they saw the God of Israel: and there was under his feet as it were a paved work of a sapphire stone, and as it were the body of heaven in his clearness.</u> (11) And upon the nobles of the children of Israel he laid not his hand: also they saw God, and did eat and drink. (12) <u>And the LORD said unto Moses, Come up to me into the mount, and be there: and I will give thee tables of stone, and a law, and commandments which I have written: that thou mayest teach them.</u> (15) <u>And Moses went up into the mount, and a cloud covered the mount.</u> (17) <u>And the sight of the glory of the LORD was like devouring fire on the top of the mount in the eyes of the children of Israel.</u> (18) ... and Moses was in the mount forty days and forty nights.		Exodus32 (1) And when the people saw that Moses delayed to come down out of the mount, the people gathered themselves together unto Aaron, and said unto him, <u>Up, make us gods, which shall go before us:</u> for as for this Moses, the man that brought us up out of the land of Egypt, we wot not what is become of him. (7) <u>And the LORD said unto Moses, Go, get thee down: for thy people, which thou broughtest out of the land of Egypt, have corrupted themselves:</u> (8) They have turned aside quickly out of the way which I commanded them: they have made them a molten calf, and have worshipped it, and have sacrificed thereunto, and said, These be thy gods, O Israel, which have brought thee up out of the land of Egypt. (11) <u>And Moses besought the LORD his God, and said, LORD, why doth thy wrath wax hot against thy people, which thou hast brought forth out of the land of Egypt with great power, and with a mighty hand? (13) Remember Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, thy servants, to whom thou swarest by thine own self, and saidst unto them, I will multiply your seed as the stars of heaven, and all this land that I have spoken of will I give unto your seed, and they shall inherit it for ever.</u> (14) <u>And the LORD repented of the evil which he thought to do unto his people.</u> (15) <u>And Moses turned, and went down from the mount, and the two tables of the testimony were in his hand: ...</u> (16) <u>And the tables were the work of God, and the writing was the writing of God, graven upon the tables.</u> (19) And it came to pass, as soon as he came nigh unto the camp, that he saw the calf, and the dancing: and Moses' anger waxed hot, and he cast the tables out of his hands, and brake them beneath the mount. (30) <u>And it came to pass on the morrow, that Moses said unto the people, Ye have sinned a great sin: and now I will go up unto the LORD: peradventure I shall make an atonement for your sin.</u> (31) <u>And Moses returned unto the LORD, and said ...</u> (32) ... if thou wilt forgive their sin; and if not, blot me, I pray thee, out of thy book which thou hast written.		Exodus34 (1) And the LORD said unto Moses, Hew thee two tables of stone like unto the first: and I will write upon these tables the words that were in the first tables, which thou brakest. (2) And be ready in the morning, and come up in the morning unto mount Sinai, and present thyself there to me in the top of the mount. (4) <u>And he hewed two tables of stone like unto the first: and Moses rose up early in the morning, and went up unto mount Sinai, as the LORD had commanded him, and took in his hand the two tables of stone.</u> (5) <u>And the LORD descended in the cloud, and stood with him there, and proclaimed the name of the LORD.</u> (6) <u>And the LORD passed by before him, and proclaimed, The LORD, The LORD God, merciful and gracious, long-suffering, and abundant in goodness and truth,</u> (7) <u>Keeping mercy for thousands, forgiving iniquity and transgression and sin, and that will by no means clear the guilty; visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children, and upon the children's children, unto the third and to the fourth generation.</u> (8) <u>And Moses made haste, and bowed his head toward the earth, and worshipped.</u> (9) And he said, <u>If now I have found grace in thy sight, O Lord, let my Lord, I pray thee, go among us: for it is a stiffnecked people: and pardon our iniquity and our sin, and take us for thine inheritance.</u> (10) <u>And he said, Behold, I make a covenant: before all thy people I will do marvels, such as have not been done in all the earth, nor in any nation; and all the people among which thou art shall see the work of the LORD: for it is a terrible thing that I will do with thee.</u> (14) <u>For thou shalt worship no other god: for the LORD, whose name is Jealous, is a jealous God:</u> (29) <u>And it came to pass, when Moses came down from mount Sinai with the two tables of testimony in Moses hand ... that the skin of his face shone while he talked with him.</u> (35) And the children of Israel saw the face of Moses, that the skin of Moses face shone: Ex35 (1) <u>And Moses gathered all the congregation of the children of Israel together, ...</u> (7)Tabernacles
